Society of St Paul

THE Society of St Paul is a congregation of priests and brothers who work exclusively in the mass media apostolate. Founded in Italy in 1914 by Blessed James Alberione, the congregation has been active in Australia for more than 50 years, after opening its first house here in 1953. Its founder was inspired by the words of Christ, "come to me all" (Mt 11:11), and he recognised that the powerful means of communication, including press, radio, television and films, must be used to bring the message of Christ's love to all people. An apostolic community, the congregation's community life supports members as they undertake their mass media apostolate.

Daughters of St Paul

THE Daughters of St Paul are women called by God to proclaim the message of the Gospel through the media. The order's spirituality

and mission are centred upon Jesus Christ and his desire that all people should know God and experience God's love for them.

The Daughters of St Paul are invited to deepen their relationship with Christ daily, through reflection on the Word of God and through the Eucharist, and to grow in every aspect of their being, so that the people whose lives they touch will encounter Christ also.

Present in more than 50 countries, the order is engaged in a variety of ministries which use the media as a means of proclaiming Jesus Christ to the world, including Pauline Books and Media Centres and Pauline Electronic Publishing.

Sister Disciples of the Divine Master

Of primary importance for the Sister Disciples is the perpetual Eucharistic adoration. The service of priestly collaboration is fulfilled in the spirit of the Virgin

Mary, disciple and mother. Committed to an intense liturgical life, the Sisters strive to convey this to those who believe in Christ as well as to those who do not yet know him.

Today they are located in 28 countries across five continents.

Sisters of Jesus Good Shepherd – Pastorelle Sisters

THE Pastorelle Sisters are women who have responded to God's call to follow Jesus and to share in his pastoral mission. Fr Alberione's vision of the value and complementary role of women in pastoral ministry led to the congregation being established in Rome on October 7, 1935. It is now in 18 countries.

The Sisters are called to be signs of the compassion of Jesus whose love reaches all people, in all circumstances of their daily life, and to be witnesses to the universal call to love and reconciliation. As religious women, they profess the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, and live in small communities.

Catechetics, adult formation in the faith, formation of pastoral workers, family visitation, liturgical animation and forming-leading prayer groups, are some expressions of their pastoral care ministry.
