Dear Brothers,

To celebrate the 108th year of the foundation of the Society of Saint Paul and the beginning of the Pauline Family is to celebrate the gift of life. In humble beginnings, we immediately find the seed that generated institutions and apostolates that over time have given substance to that "come to me" that illuminated the life of the young James Alberione. Many years have passed, yet we carry in our hearts the joy of the gift received, that of being apostles today like St Paul, chosen and sent to be Pauline "editors", or apostles like Mary Queen of the Apostles, she who gave the world the Saviour. This expression is part of what the chapter confreres have chosen as a goal for the next six years, it is what the Spirit has suggested to us to give continuity to what Blessed Alberione has received from God and given to us as an inheritance.

Finally, we recall that today – ad experimentum and for a duration of five years – the new Statute of the Association of Pauline Cooperators comes into force. It will be a journey that will also see our Circumscriptions committed to revive together the same Pauline mission.
