At one-thirty of Sunday, 7 August 2011, the day of the Lord, while recovering in the *Hospital Spagnolo*, our priest-confreere Fr. José Sávio Pereira (Pe. Crisóstomo) went to meet our heavenly Father.

FATHER JOSÉ SÁVIO PEREIRA (Fr. João Crisóstomo)
83 years old, 64 years of Pauline life, 57 years as priest

Fr. José Sávio Pereira, was born 5 April 1928 in Queluz City, in the State of São Paulo. The son of José Augusto Pereira and Maria da Conceição Pereira, he was baptised on 14 April 1928 in the parish of Queluz, in the diocese of Taubaté and received confirmation on 15 August 1930 in the parish of Cruzeiro.

He entered the Society of Saint Paul at the age of 12, on 19 February 1940, residing in Major Maragliano Street, in the neighbourhood of Villa Mariana in São Paulo. He was in this House when he completed his Aspirancy, Postulancy, Novitiate and Juniorate.

He made his first profession in the Society of Saint Paul on 25 January 1947, while his perpetual profession was on 25 January 1950. He finished his theological studies in Roma, and on 5 December 1954 he was ordained Priest at the Sanctuary of the Queen of Apostles, which was recently consecrated.

Fr. Crisóstomo lived in the communities of São Paulo (Major Maragliano), Rome, Caxias do Sul, Cidade Paulina, Vila Mariana and Rio de Janeiro. He exercised his Pauline apostolate as Superior of communities, teaching the seminarians, in the editorial and revision sectors. For many years he lent his pastoral ministry in the Parish of Saint Ignatius, and was Spiritual Director of our seminarians.

During the last years he lived with his sickness outside of our community and in these last days he was recovering in the Intensive Care Unit, where the Lord called him to himself.

Let us recommend this Confreere of ours to the Father and invoke for him His infinite mercy that saves and justifies.

And he will intercede for us all before the Lord, particularly for the apostolic needs of the Paulines in Brazil.
